Hi Captain -

ENE winds at 13-17 knots will continue through this evening, then wind speeds overnight will drop back to 10-14 knots as the vessel edges south of 10N. Seas will be running 5-7 feet, mainly in swells from the NE with periods of 8-10 seconds. Wind waves will be just a foot or two this evening, then will become negligible later at night as winds become lighter.

ENE winds tomorrow will pick up a bit to 12-16 knots through tomorrow along the route with seas continuing at 5-7 feet. Tomorrow night and Monday wind speeds will push up a bit to 13-17 knots, still from the ENE, and swells will build to 6-8 feet. Monday night as the vessel heads more to the southeast after passing 50W winds will shift to ESE and drop off to 10-14 knots with seas subsiding to 5-7 feet. Showers will become more widespread later Monday night as the vessel moves farther south, and a few thundershowers or squalls will be possible.

Winds will back to ENE again later Tuesday with speeds of 12-16 knots, and swells building to 6-8 feet. These conditions will continue along the route through the middle of the week. Occasional showers will remain possible through this period.

No changes to the voyage plan are needed at this time.
